Skills Funding Agency & ESF Programme





Forming a partnership with a range of strategic and delivery providers, CRP has recently submitted a funding bid to help candidates into work in the retail, hospitality and tourism sector in central and south London, building on the work of our Recruit London initiative.

This opportunity was released as part of the London 2014-2020 European Social Fund Programme. The Skills Funding Agency matched the funding and released an ITT covering sector skills. One provider will be successful to deliver a £2.69m project to support unemployed and disadvantaged groups into the retail and hospitality sector across 16 central and south London. The funding is for the delivery of regulated and non-regulated training, brokerage into jobs or apprenticeships, support to sustain and progress in work for six months.

The results of the bid will be released on 23rd August. We would like to thank all partners who supported our application, provided information and joined us as delivery partners.

On 5th July CRP attended the GLA's Clean Air Act Anniversary Address event at Great Ormond Street Hospital to hear the Mayor launch his consultation on new measures to tackle air quality. The early stage consultation ends on 29th July, <u>click here</u> to respond.

The Mayor is keeping his campaign promises to make radical changes to improve air quality and meet EU limits across the capital by 2025. In addition to the consultation on the new toxicity charge (t-charge) and extension to the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ), the Mayor's office have announced their commitment to remove traffic from Oxford Street.

Business-led Air Quality Strategy



On 28th June New West End Company launched their Air Quality Strategy with support from Cross River Partnership. The strategy is engaging businesses to take action to reduce their impact on poor air quality in the West End.

Jace Tyrell, Chief Executive at the New West End Company, introduced the The Air Quality Summit event held at the Regent Street Cinema. Ben Rogers of think tank Centre for London chaired a lively discussion on the requirement for a collaborative approach from the public and private sectors to address the critical issue of air quality. Ben was joined by panel speakers Valerie Shawcross CBE, London Deputy Mayor for Transport; Alex Williams, Head of Planning at TfL; Councillor Heather Acton, Cabinet Member for Sustainability & Parking at Westminster City Council; and Steven Medway, Managing Director of Trading Environment at New West End Company.

The event was well attended with representatives from businesses on and around Bond Street, Oxford Street & Regent Street, Business Improvement Districts, Westminster City Council, London Borough of Camden, TfL and Greater London Authority Air Quality teams.

In the foyer, there was a 'market place' where organisations such as Transport for London, CRP, Arup, Parcelly, Zipcar and Geze that are able to support businesses to take action on air quality were providing information on practical solutions to the problem of pollution in London's West End.

A flying start for Freight TAILS in Suceava, Romania



The Freight TAILS kick-off meeting of European partners was hosted superbly by our partner City of Suceava, Romania on 27-28 June 2016. With over 120 organisations already involved in local Freight TAILS groups across Europe, this first transnational meeting focussed on how to attract, and work with a range of stakeholders all of whom have an interest in urban freight. Future transnational meetings will focus issues around urban freight and: data; integration; regulation and enforcement; voluntary behaviour; and procurement. New FREVUE partner BREYTNER deploys 19 tonne electric trucks in Rotterdam



On 27 June BREYTNER Zero Emission Transport launched operations with two 19 tonne trucks in Rotterdam. The trucks are fully electric and will be re-charged using solar energy, making them a truly zero emission delivery option for urban distribution. "We view the air quality issue as a challenge, not as an obstacle. This position has made us successful and has helped us develop, together with our clients, this clean solution." says Marie-José Baartmans, director at BREYTNER.

BREYTNER offer their services for business to business and business to consumer deliveries. In their hub concept a modular system of swap bodies is driven two or three at a time from a national/regional distribution centre to city boundaries or those of low emission zones. Here the sealed swap bodies are parked and driven into the inner city one by one by fully electric truck.
