<u>Cross River Partnership</u> (CRP) was joined by <u>Transport for London</u> and <u>Sustrans</u> for an in-depth discussion on active travel and it's benefits on improving air quality for businesses, employees, residents and visitors. Speakers highlighted how we can utilise a wide variety of active travel modes to our advantage, both during and postlockdown, to spearhead a green recovery with active travel as a main component. The session covered important updates from the TfL's Streetspace Programme as well as the safety measures being implemented across its bus, tube and train networks. Sustrans shared its Space to Move tool and delivered advice on how to get started on traveling by bike in the capital.
