New Arrangements for Businesses after Wednesday 2nd December

With the national lockdown restrictions changing from **2nd December**, <u>London</u> <u>Councils</u> have recently published some useful updates around hospitality, opening hours and the cost of COVID-19:

London groups including BIDs, the <u>GLA</u> and <u>London Councils</u> are also calling for an end to the 10pm curfew for licenced premises. Boroughs have been asked to consider the implications of potential later opening hours with their business community in the run up to Christmas, including the licencing and community safety aspects. Additionally, the <u>British Business Bank</u> has published <u>new analysis</u> on the take up of the COVID-19 loans.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson has published his ten-point plan for creating a 'green industrial revolution' for 250,000 new jobs. The blueprint covers clean energy, transport, nature and innovative technologies and is backed by £12bn of government investment. Read the plan <u>here</u>.

Upcoming Healthy Streets Everyday Guidance Document on Mobility Justice

As part of the <u>Healthy Streets Everyday (HSE)</u> programme, CRP is pleased to announce an **upcoming Guidance Document** that discusses **Mobility Justice**. The guidance, that will be published in a few weeks' time, explores several stories of mobility (in)justice faced by individuals with a disability or mobility impairment.

So what actually is mobility justice? In essence, it is the principle that all people should have the same opportunity to move around and access a space or place regardless of their physical ability, race, sexuality or any other characteristic. Unfortunately, transport can be one of the principal barriers faced by persons with disabilities or impaired mobilities. To make our transport and mobilities more inclusive, it is important to understand the challenges experienced by those that face mobility and transport barriers.

Road Safety Week 2020

Road Safety Week, the UK's biggest road safety event, coordinated annually by the road safety charity <u>Brake</u>, took place this year from 16th - 22nd November. The week aims to inspire thousands of schools, organisations and communities to take action on road safety and promote life-saving messages, during the week and beyond.

The importance of road safety is crucial to the success of CRP's <u>Healthy Streets</u> <u>Everyday (HSE) programme</u>. Unfortunately, morning and evening rush hours are a common time for road traffic accidents involving children. HSE have recently funded the <u>Hackney School Streets Hotline</u>, a service for borough officers across all of London to get tailored, up-to-date and site-specific advice to support the implementation of school streets. School streets encourage more active travel to and from sites around Schools and reduce the number of cars on the road at specific times to allow children and others to walk, cycle and scoot more safely. The <u>London</u> <u>Borough of Hackney</u> have excellent experience in delivering school streets, with over 30 in operation and more continually being added! The service was used by 14 local authorities with 18 calls being taken and support provided.

New Local Cargo Bike Schemes Launch This Month!

CRP has launched a number of new cargo bike schemes as part of the <u>Clean Air</u> <u>Villages</u> project. These schemes will support local business communities to deliver their products and services to their customers, positively impacting on air quality as well as saving time and resources. The schemes help a range of businesses from market traders, to independent stores delivering art, wine, essential supplies and even paint!

In London Borough of Richmond, RV Tass has started a weekly delivery slot to deliver paint to those in the local community. Over in Tooting, London Borough of Wandsworth, market trader Gemma, owner of Love Art, has started utilising the trial to provide a delivery service for her customers. In Wimbledon, London Borough of Merton, Fielders is preparing to have a weekly cargo bike delivery slot to enable customers to still order from home!

CRP's Spotlight On: Brixton BID

This week, we are showcasing the work of CRP BID partner <u>Brixton BID</u>. Established in 2014 by local businesses, Brixton BID works to make the district a sustainable and distinctive destination. Hear what Managing Director <u>Gianluca Rizzo</u> and Projects Lead <u>Reece Simwogerere</u> have to say about Evie, the BID's shared electric vehicle:

Brixton BID has managed to secure a continuation of the exclusive and unlimited access to the first-ever <u>shared electric van 'Evie'</u> to all Brixton businesses in partnership with <u>Zipcar</u> and <u>London Borough of Lambeth</u>. As members will be aware, the project began with CRP involved, as part of CRP's <u>Defra</u>-funded <u>Clean Air</u> <u>Villages 2</u> programme, in November 2019. Evie has a positive impact on air quality and helps small businesses transition to low-carbon ways of working.

The joint initiative, The Brixton Electric Van Project, aims to help businesses thrive and create a positive impact on the community and was due to end on 25th November 2020. However, thanks to the positive feedback received regarding many benefits delivered to local businesses, the BID and partners are happy to announce that **Evie will remain in Brixton and give local businesses exclusive shared access** 24/7. This project has so far proven to be an unqualified success for Brixton, with usage over the initial one year period resulting in the equivalent miles of driving to New York City! All of these miles would have been otherwise driven by a tailpipe polluting equivalent.

Gianluca Rizzo, Managing Director of the Brixton BID, said of the update, "In these difficult economic times, we are doing everything to support our businesses whilst also being considerate towards the environment. Our mission to make Brixton a sustainable business destination continues."





Illuminated River Shines!

CRP was excited to see the <u>Illuminated River</u> project showcased in London's iconic <u>Time Out magazine</u> on 4th November, by <u>Eddy Frankel</u>:

"Over the past few years, artist <u>Leo Villareal</u> (in collaboration with architects <u>Lifschutz</u> <u>Davidson Sandilands</u>) has been transforming central London's bridges with mesmerising light installations, as part of the 'Illuminated River' project. He's already given London Bridge, Cannon Street, Southwark and Millennium bridges (between the <u>London Borough of Southwark</u> and the <u>City of London Corporation</u>) the flashy treatment, and now he's finally doing the iconic Waterloo Bridge (between the <u>London Borough of Lambeth</u> and <u>Westminster City Council</u>).

Works will be completed in **early 2021**, and then he'll move on to Lambeth Bridge, Westminster Bridge and all the rest. By the time it's completed, it will be the longest (as well as free, outdoors and Covid-safe) public artwork in the world."

The Illuminated River project has been a huge collaboration between a large number of disparate organisations, led by the Illuminated River Foundation's <u>Sarah Gaventa</u>.

Stepping Our Way to Minsk, Belarus or Malaga!

Amid another lockdown and after 7+ months of working from home, the <u>CRP team</u> have been getting creative when it comes to getting active. While many of us have been enjoying the benefits of working from home - no more early morning commutes - we've also been missing some things: the face-to-face catchups over cups of tea, the lunchtime brainstorms and the excuse to move about our city and get out of our cosy homes!

To motivate ourselves to keep active, four weeks ago we started a **CRP Step Challenge** – dividing our team into two groups, to compete for the highest increase in daily step counts. Over the last few weeks, team members have increased their daily totals competing in Weekend Warrior challenges in preparation for the final week where each participant needed to increase their daily step count by 4,000 steps!
