<u>Cross River Partnership</u> (CRP) hosted its final LiveShare event on Thursday 17th December, where we hosted a pre-recorded session with Alastair Moss, Deputy for Ward of Cheap at the <u>City of London Corporation</u>, who covered the City's recovery from the pandemic and their City Plan 2036 on futureproofing the City.

We were also joined live by Matthew Dillon, Associate Director at <u>Arup</u>, who introduced their policy-orientated research study for the <u>Greater London Authority</u> on the economic futures of the Central Activities Zone.
