On **Thursday 25th February, 1:15pm - 2pm**, CRP Technical Project Officer **Abby McDougall** and Project Manager **Fiona Coull** will outline current monitoring as part of CRP's projects, including the latest insights from a 3-month traffic and road user monitoring programme. In collaboration with <u>Vivacity</u>, CRP have analysed data from sensors installed at 14 locations across London. This programme cuts across two of CRP's projects, the <u>Defra</u>-funded <u>Clean Air Villages</u> project and <u>Mayor of London</u>-funded <u>Healthy</u>. <u>Streets Everyday</u> programme, to help CRP and partners understand how the COVID-19 pandemic is impacting traffic and active travel on London's streets.

- Transforming monitoring data to be meaningful and practical for transport planning

- · How captured data can aid the decision-making process

**Final Stages of CRP's Vivacity Monitoring Project** 



CRP's Vivacity Monitoring Project is reaching it's final stages, with the last 3-month trial period being completed earlier this month and data analysis now in full swing.

The project has involved installing 16 <u>Vivacity</u> sensors across London at locations chosen by partners from CRP's <u>Clean Air Villages 3</u> and <u>Healthy Streets Everyday</u> programmes. By providing partners with these rich datasets and in-depth analysis, CRP is helping to provide the proof of concept for partner interventions as well as robust guidance and support in terms of monitoring and data interpretation.

# New CLSRTP Summary Report Launched

Since the start of the pandemic in the UK, in March 2020, the <u>Central London Sub-</u><u>Regional Transport Partnership</u> (CLSRTP) have increased the frequency of their meetings to adapt to the changing nature of transport use across London. The partners have shaped the CLSRTP research projects to coordinate the <u>TfL Streetspace responses</u> and transport sector more widely, in adapting to future changes as a result of the COVID-19 crisis.

CRP has collated all innovative research projects into an <u>informative summary</u> <u>report</u>, which gives a concise review of the key achievements that have taken place since April 2020. The projects showcase the successful collaboration of the partnership, who are pioneering bold new methods of transport strategy that will ensure a resilient and sustainable course for the future of transport management in the capital.

### Shepherding Businesses Towards an Electric Future

CRP is excited to announce it will be launching a shared electric van in Shepherd's Bush as part of the <u>Clean Air</u> <u>Villages 3</u> project.

In collaboration with <u>London Borough of</u> <u>Hammersmith & Fulham</u>, Zipcar and <u>Land</u> <u>Securities</u>, a fully electric vehicle will be available for local businesses and community organisations to use for free. This electric venture will encourage behaviour change around the use of electric vehicles and showcase the benefits of shared vehicle schemes.

CRP is currently engaging with the local business community to sign-up interested parties. Journeys made by an electric van versus a diesel equivalent will result in a
