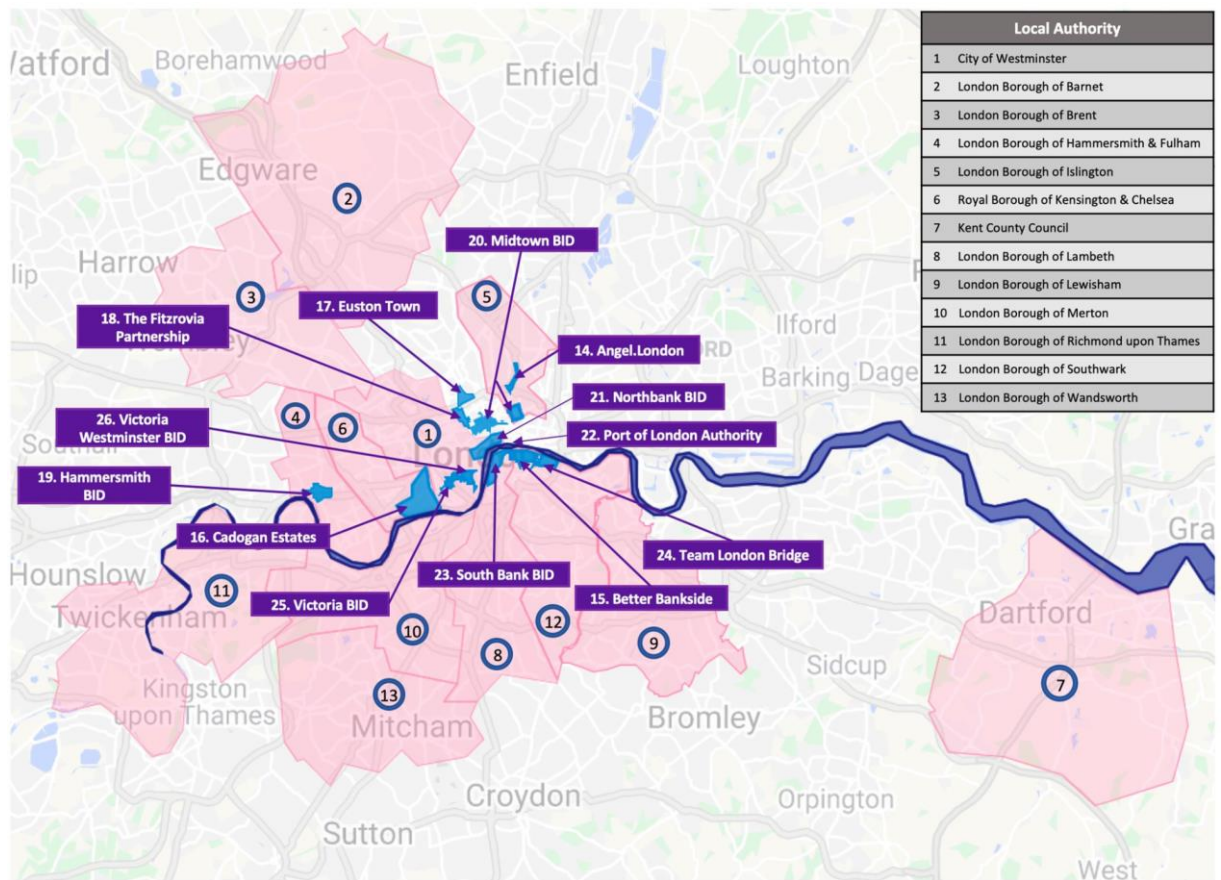




CAV4 Project Summary

Cross River Partnership (CRP) has secured £700,000 from Defra's Air Quality Grant to deliver the Clean Air Villages 4 (CAV4) project, with partners match funding £20,000 each, cash and / or in-kind. Westminster City Council is the lead partner. The CAV4 project will be delivered from March 2021 June 2022.

Building on the work undertaken through the Defra-funded Clean Air Villages 1- 3 projects, CAV4 aims to deliver ambitious **Freight Solutions for a Clean Air business recovery from COVID-19**. The CAV4 Freight Solutions implemented will incorporate Consolidation; Distribution; Mode; Technology; and Policy elements, trialled across different 'Villages'. CAV4 will enhance CRP's measureBEST monitoring tool, to capture, measure and analyse pollutants (including NO₂, CO₂, PMs) within 25 locations identified by Greater London Authority as *air quality focus areas*, characterised by high levels of air pollution and population density.

The 26 project **partners** for CAV4 are: London Boroughs of Barnet, Brent, Hammersmith & Fulham, Islington, Lambeth, Lewisham, Merton, Richmond upon Thames, Royal Borough of Kensington & Chelsea, Southwark, Wandsworth, and Westminster City Council, Kent County Council, as well as Business Improvement Districts (BIDs); angel.london, Better Bankside, Central District Alliance, Euston Town, The Fitzrovia Partnership, Hammersmith, Northbank, South Bank, Team London Bridge, Victoria and Victoria Westminster, plus Landowner Cadogan Estates and Strategic Partner the Port of London Authority (PLA).
