CAV4 Project Recap



Clean Air Villages 4 (CAV4) is a <u>Defra</u> funded AQ project led by <u>Westminster City Council</u> in collaboration

with 26 project partners to improve the air quality across different London 'villages', where both air pollution and population density levels are high.

£700,000 was granted to CRP (the largest portion), with additional match funding from **26** project partners of **£520,000**.

26 Partners: 13 Local Authorities, 11 Business Improvement Districts, Cadogan Estates and the Port of London Authority.

Project length: 1st April 2021 to 30th June 2022.

CAV4 will build on the successes of the award winning <u>CAV1</u> programme, as well as <u>CAV2</u> and <u>CAV3</u>, which all focused on interventions to support businesses, communities and hospitals. CAV4 aims to deliver ambitious Freight Solutions for a Clean Air business recovery from COVID-19.

Consolidation

Outputs:

Zero emission vehicles and increased use of Dartford hub: Promotion of EV dongles and the KCC try-beforeyou-buy EV scheme has taken place.

• River freight:

- EMSOL report complete and published
- River freight pilot TBC launching 18th July, now being funded by CAV4 and CALL
- Site visits complete
- Dummy run

• Consolidation of suppliers:

- Cadogan preferred supplier scheme. Chosen supplier has been introduced to Cadogan.
- Richmond road map for Environmental audits complete.







Distribution

Outputs:

- Expansion of Urban Logistics Map:
 - CRP are still actively pursuing opportunities to add sites to the micro hub map.
- Sustainable Freight hub:
 - Lambeth: 5 businesses now use the micro hub, that take deliveries to and from the hub in SE1 to Brixton, in a variety of ways. The project has been extended until March 2023 through funding from Impact on Urban Health, so we are still signing up more businesses now.
 - Kensington & Chelsea: this will not be going ahead as unfortunately there was not a space in North West London to operate the trial out of that a cargo bike provider would find suitable.
- Circular Economy Trial (e.g. Reverse logistics):
 - This will not be going ahead as unfortunately there was not a suitable office in the Angel area that would participate in the trial. The is an intention to begin reverse logistics through the sustainable freight hub project with reusable boxes collected from a florist.
- Virtual Loading Bay monitoring:
 - This will not be going ahead as unfortunately it does not fit within the timescales of the project.







Mode

Oututs :

- **EV Dongles**:
 - Telematic dongles 21 EV dongles were sent out to 7 participating businesses. Out of these 21 EV dongles, 5 are still currently collecting live data, but should be uninstalled soon.
- Cargo Bikes:
 - Cargo bike delivery schemes delivered in Brent (Willesden Green), Merton (Wimbledon) and Putney (Wandsworth).
 - A shared Cargo bike scheme was also launched in partnership with Camden BID (Camden). This will be available for local businesses and residents to use.
 - Cargo bike has been procured for Lewisham Council staff (particularly those that work for Lewisham Homes). Training for the bike is being provided on the 26th and 28th of July.
- River Freight / Rail Freight / Walking Freight:
 - All studies have now been published
