

Background: Midtown BID

Increased skills and employability of local residents.






Case Study – Euston Green Link

Provide Proof of Concept

Generating evidence to assess the impact of an intervention or scheme

Build trust and confidence



Allay concerns or fears

Inform the success of future schemes

Support the transition to permanent schemes
