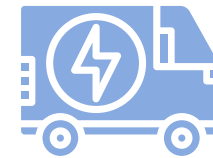


Brixton Hub - Information for Suppliers

Advantages of using the hub space



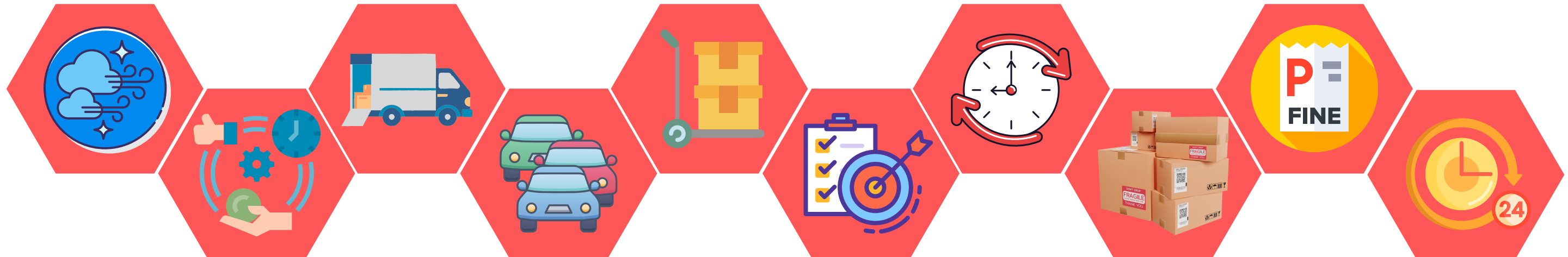

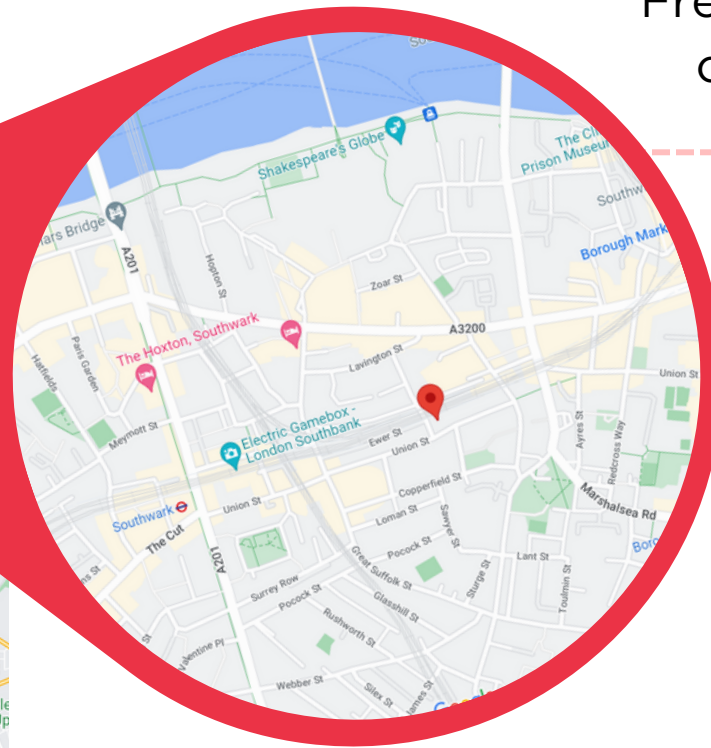
