

Firstly, we would like to say a big thank you to everyone who attended our <u>Lunchtime Launch series</u> of events in 2021. <u>Cross River Partnership</u>, with 21 external speakers, brought **1,875 people together**, 553% more than our 2020 events! 336 loyal attendees came to at least two events last year, and we had 829 brand-new attendees discovering our online sessions.

And we want to make 2022 even better! So we're launching <u>CRP's Connect 4 Series</u>. This will bring you exciting topics at <u>4pm on the last Thursday of each month</u>.

Making the Switch: A Guide for Fleet Owners

We are pleased to launch the latest <u>Clean Air Villages 4</u> case study '<u>Making the Switch: A Guide for Fleet Owners</u>'!

This explores eight in-depth experiences from businesses with electric vehicle (EV) fleets in London. This aims to provide information to make the transition easier for businesses looking to purchase or lease an electric fleet.

More Londoners are buying electric vehicles, and 34% of consumers have been found to choose brands with environmentally sustainable practices over those without. Using examples from Cleanology, Complete, Father Nature, Fruit4London, GLH, GreenZone, Lyreco and Planet Minimal, this case study addresses fleet, charging, advice and guidance.

It also examines what going electric could mean for a business. CRP asked questions about each business' vehicles, motivations, challenges faced, charging infrastructure and what's next for EVs in terms of regulation, technology and cost.

Shepherd's Bush Shared EV Launch



This month, <u>London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham</u> have launched the shared electric vehicle (EV) project in Shepherd's Bush. This is a legacy of CRP's <u>Clean Air Villages 3 (CAV3)</u> programme and CRP is supporting the borough with business engagement.

The shared EV is free for businesses across the borough to use. The project aims to promote vehicle sharing schemes and the use of EVs in place of more polluting alternatives. This concept first started with a shared EV in Brixton, which launched as part of the CAV2) programme.

The EV in Shepherd's Bush is being provided by <u>Zipcar</u> and parks and charges at the <u>W12 shopping centre</u>. Eligible businesses need to <u>register with Zipcar</u> and can then book the vehicle for business journeys. The four Clean Air Villages programmes have been funded by <u>Defra's Air Quality Grant</u>.

Richmond businesses invited to use FREE dongles



As part of <u>Clean Air Villages 4</u>, <u>CRP</u> and <u>London Borough of Richmond upon Thames</u> are providing local businesses with an opportunity to monitor and assess their fleet for Electric Vehicle (EV) suitability - for free!


Through the scheme, businesses can <u>apply for FREE telematic dongle devices</u> that can be used to carry out an EV suitability assessment. The dongles, which are provided by <u>Geotab</u>, enable businesses to understand information such as their current vehicle's driving speeds, distances, daily mileages, and parking locations. This provides a unique insight into their delivery needs, helping to identify whether a business would benefit from purchasing an EV.

Following the monitoring, businesses are provided with their own personalised EV suitability assessment report to assist with the first steps of the procurement process.

Do you have vacant space that could be hired by a courier company?



Cross River Partnership (CRP) have created an online map that shows unused spaces across London which could be used as distribution centres for zero-emission couriers.



CRP create business introductions between you and these zero-emission couriers.



Zero-emission couriers can operate at different sizes; from cargo bikes to electric vans.



This scheme is supported by the Central Government and London Local Authorities.

<u>Cross River Partnership</u>'s <u>online map</u> shows unused commercial and industrial spaces across London which could be used by couriers as consolidation hubs across London.

These consolidation hubs will receive deliveries from many different couriers and suppliers, before being delivered in the last-mile on bicycles or on foot, instead of polluting vehicles. They are great for reducing traffic and pollution, and contributing to greener, safer and more vibrant neighbourhoods in London. Storage units, railway arches and warehouses make great consolidation hubs! This could be a source of extra revenue and contribute to cleaner air across London.

So what do you do if you have a vacant space in London?

- 3. CRP will add it to the map and introduce you to any couriers who enquire.

Energy Saving Week 2022



17th - 23rd January was the <u>Big Energy Saving Week!</u> The week consisted of a campaign run in partnership between the <u>Citizens Advice</u>, the <u>Energy Saving Trust</u> and the <u>Department for Business</u>, <u>Energy & Industrial Strategy</u> supported by charities and organisations promoting public awareness to help people think of ways to cut their energy bills whilst making their homes more energy efficient.

With the cost of gas and electricity bills rising, it is important to take action to minimise costs whilst keeping warm and cosy when at home. There are a range of ideas to reduce the cost of fuel bills by ensuring that your home is well-insulated, to avoid heat escaping. Heat is most likely to escape around doors and windows. Some simple and relatively cheap things you can easily do could be:

- Turning down the heating thermostat by 1 degree.
- Installing foam strips around doors and windows to fill gaps and using a draught excluder.
- Install secondary glazing film, thermal curtains, or blinds over draughty windows.
- Top up loft insulation to a depth of 27cm.
- · For a draughty floor use a rug.


Why try vegan?

Open City's motto is "a charity dedicated to making London and its architecture more open, accessible and equitable." Open City grew out of Open House London, a festival that has run for over 30 years and grown into a global movement.

London is a city not just formed from its physical built environment, but also by centuries of people and their voices. Open City focuses on London's stories as much as its fabric, looking at reformers, architects, politicians and public bodies who shaped the city we know today. They champion issues of social equality, education, health and environmental issues and promote considered and successful spaces, both historical and new.

Now Open City produces <u>podcasts</u>, <u>publications</u>, <u>films</u> and <u>all-year round events</u>. They also run educational and mentoring programmes, including <u>Accelerate</u> for aspiring built environment professionals, particularly from under-represented backgrounds. Architecture and the built environment is often seen as an elitist profession or interest, and Open City sets out to change that perception.

Their mission is to encourage all people to engage in London and its architecture. Public health starts with the built environment.
