






Climate Emergency in Southwark

We will do all we can to make Southwark a Carbon Neutral borough by 2030













An Social Justice Issue for Southwark

- Health and disease Extreme heat and cold, rise in insect borne disease, and air pollution. Already 200 premature deaths a year due to air pollution
- Rainfall and flooding 60% of Southwark is less than 10m above sea level
- Food supply around 75,000 of residents are food insecure
- Conflict and migration richly diverse borough, connected globally













Our Plan

- Greener buildings
- Active and sustainable travel
- > Thriving natural environment
- > A circular economy with green jobs
- Renewable energy













Active and Sustainable Travel

What is needed?

- Need a 9% reduction in vehicle kilometers in Southwark with a modal shift to active and pubic transport.
- All petrol and diesel cars and buses to be removed by 2030

Programme of work

- Making walking and cycling easier
- Discourage ownership of polluting private cars
- Improve accessibility and sustainability of public transport
- Reduce unnecessary journeys
- Cut down on unnecessary flying and encourage offsetting
- Decarbonise council travel












Our Approach

Educate, Empower, Engage

- Let's Go Zero Schools Network, new council training, partnership with LCC
- Wide engagement talking lampposts, community forums, pop up events, online engagement, annual conference and a Citizens Jury
- Online interactive action plan















Work is underway

- Retrofit on council-owned buildings including LED installation, solar PV on nine new sites, air-source heat pumps, glazing improvements and insulation upgrades.
- Introduced a diesel surcharge and delivery of electric vehicle charging (nearly 400 charge points in total), including new charge points at council buildings.
- Surpassed the target of planting 10,000 trees by 2022 and significantly expanded our Allotment Guarantee, with 108 new allotment plots created on estates.
- £16 million of funding secured to bring a low-carbon heat network to a new area of Southwark, expected to deliver on average 11,100 tonnes of carbon savings each year.
- Allocated an additional £2.18 million of funding to accelerate plans to switch all street lighting to LED, cutting carbon emissions in half















Changing how the council works

- Climate change concurrents in all reports, ensuring that due thought is given to the impacts of all decisions taken by the council on emissions.
- Set up key funding streams to develop new carbon-saving projects, through the Green Buildings Fund and the Climate Capital Fund.
- Reviewing all council strategies to align with Climate Change commitments, and developing new ones such as Adaptation, EV Charging and an update to the New Southwark Plan
- Working with businesses and a green new deal to deliver a borough partnership








Figure 8.13 Walking and cycling casualties on neighbourhood roads, 2016-18 average vs 2007-09 baseline.



























































Cycle Network expansion 2016-2022





250km of new cycle routes delivered since 2016 – an increase of over 250%









































































