Clean Air Logistics for London is in its final month!



It's the final month of CRP's <u>Clean Air Logistics for London (CALL)</u> Programme and CRP has been as busy as ever! Here's a quick overview of what we've been up to this month:

- We've been working on an event to celebrate the launch of <u>The London Light</u>
 <u>Freight Walking Trial</u>. As part of this, there is an opportunity for businesses in the
 local area to see the e-walker in action and hear about how to get involved in the
 trial.
- This month the third drop was successfully completed as part of CRP's 'River <u>Freight Pilot – Part 2</u>'. A <u>Q&A session</u> was recorded to help businesses understand how they can get involved.
- The second month of data has been provided for the <u>Westminster City Council Micro Logistics Hub trial</u>. We will be sharing these in a final report once the trial is complete.
- The retrofit of 'The Albert' (to make the vessel fully electric) is also nearing completion and the vessel has been renamed to Alb-E.
- We have also sent out a RFP for a courier to occupy an urban logistics hub in Wandsworth at the Southside Shopping Centre. This will be delivered in a similar way to the hub with Westminster City Council and learnings will be shared as part of CRP's Smarter Greener Logistics (SGL) Programme.
- Several reports and models have also been commissioned in relation to the Waterloo Freight Hub. These are designed to show the impact of a freight hub at Waterloo station and highlight the economic, environmental and social benefits that this would bring to the local area and London more widely.

Rail Freight into London



CRP is continuing its work with the <u>Great British Railways Transition Team (GBRTT)</u>, <u>Network Rail (NWR)</u> and the <u>Department for Transport (DfT)</u> to try to get more freight into London via rail rather than via road.

The rise of low-volume, high-margin markets requiring fast delivery, such as fast-fashion, have been identified as being suitable for fast rail freight. 4,000 tons of carbon dioxide (CO2) could be saved each year by using rail freight, which could take 8,300 HGVs off the road.

As part of its <u>Clean Air Logistics for London (CALL)</u> and <u>Smarter Greener Logistics (SGL)</u> programmes, CRP has been busy commissioning transport consultants <u>Steer</u> and <u>Intermodality</u> to model the beneficial impacts of bringing more freight into London via rail, and then delivering it across London via zero emission modes such as e-cargo bikes.

Results will be available over the summer, but we are anticipating that they could include significant job creation and economic opportunities as well as huge positive environmental benefits for Londoners.

Scaling up: Monthly bulk deliveries on the Thames



CRP has recently launched the <u>River Freight Pilot Part Two – Scaling.up: Monthly bulk</u> deliveries on the Thames!

The trial is the second edition of CRP's River Freight Pilot, which operated one delivery per week, for six weeks, over the summer of 2022.

This year's six-month trial is focused on the monthly bulk delivery of goods to make river freight more economically viable for the suppliers involved in the trial, and there is an ambition for the service to become a permanent feature of their future logistics operations. The trial is a collaboration between <u>Absolutely Courier</u>, <u>Antalis</u>, <u>CPBS Marine Services</u>, <u>Complete</u>, <u>Transport for London River Services</u>, <u>Mayflower Washroom Solutions</u>, <u>The Northbank BID</u> and the <u>Port of London Authority</u>.

Goods are loaded at TfL's Woolwich Ferry, <u>Royal Borough of Greenwich</u>, and travel into central London via the Thames to Temple Pier in <u>City of Westminster</u>. Cargo bikes, operated by <u>Absolutely Courier</u>, are then used to deliver goods from Temple Pier to their final destinations.
