Smarter Greener Logistics | Update



As the year comes to a close, CRP are reflecting on what's been a fantastic start to the delivery of the <u>Defra</u>-funded <u>Smarter Greener Logistics</u> (SGL) programme!

While, it has only been 6 months since the launch of the programme, CRP have encouraging and exciting updates to share with you below:

- CRP will be supporting a 6-month micro-logistics hub in the undercroft of <u>Waterloo</u> Station.
- CRP's <u>Pimlico Hub</u> has removed 3,260kg CO2 over 7 months, and other hubs are in the pipeline.
- CRP will enable up to 6 local authorities to trial virtual loading bays in 2 locations, improving air quality and reduce congestion levels.
- CRP will support the installation of parcel lockers in <u>Richmond</u>, <u>Wandsworth</u>, <u>Hackney</u> and potentially other locations.
- Fully fund and support the installation of electric charging infrastructure at up to 3 agreed locations.
- Reduce carbon emissions by incorporating cargo bikes or walking freight as part of the last-mile delivery.
- CRP is acting as a bridge between local authorities and logistics operators, encouraging and enabling a shift towards low-carbon logistics.
- CRP is monitoring benefits of being part of the SGL programme in terms of Nitrogen Dioxide / Oxides, Particulate Matter (2.5 & 10) and Carbon Dioxide.

 Support the integration of river freight with parcel lockers, virtual loading bays, and low emission onward delivery.

Focussing on Freight at the Thames & London Waterways Forum



CRP's Senior Programme Manager, Fiona Coull, was delighted to have sat on the 'Planning and Freight' Panel as part of the annual Thames & London Waterways Forum earlier this month.

The forum, which was organised by the <u>Port of London Authority</u> (PLA), <u>Transport for London</u> (TfL) and <u>Greater London Authority</u> (GLA), was a brilliant opportunity to connect various stakeholders to discuss the region's blue spaces.

During the panel, <u>CRP's 'London Light Freight River Trial'</u> was referenced as a key case study to highlight the logistics opportunities that The Thames can provide. The trial, which was London's first daily, multi-supplier, river freight trial that incorporated return deliveries, removed 3 vans from London's roads, increased efficiency, improved reliability and resulted in emissions savings of 92% for NOx, 96% for CO2, 79% for PM10 and 78% for PM2.5

Clean Air Thames vessel, Driftwood II, at Barrier Gardens Pier



CRP joined <u>Clean Air Thames</u> project partners, the <u>Port of London Authority</u> (PLA) and the <u>City of London Corporation</u>, to take photos with Driftwood II at the newly refurbished Barrier Gardens Pier last month.

Driftwood II, which is owned by the PLA, is used to collect debris from the Thames. The 34-year-old vessel was one of two vessels retrofitted to reduce air pollutants in its exhaust as part of Clean Air Thames which was funded through Round 3 of the Mayor's Air Quality Fund.

The other vessel was GPS Anglia owned by GPS Marine Contractors.

Researchers from <u>University College London</u> analysed the vessel's exhaust before and after the work was carried out. Their measurements showed reductions across all compounds monitored, including nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, particulate matter, with the greatest improvements at the highest engine speeds.


The Waterloo Freight Hub has the potential to remove large delivery vehicles from the roads, replaced by zero emission delivery methods such as cargo bikes, electric vans and walking porters. This could have huge environmental, social and economic benefits for London, potentially impacting 3.5 million people and 200,000 businesses in inner London.
