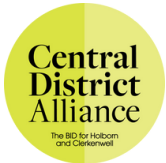



Reflecting on 30 Years

Cross River Partnership is proud to have delivered 30 years of exciting projects that have shaped London.



Healthy Streets Everyday
 coordinated by CRP, supports London's COVID response by enabling walking and cycling through initiatives such as school streets and car-free zones.



Alb-E
 London's first fully electric workboat launches in 2023, enabled by funding levered in by CRP.



Millennium Bridge
 one of CRP's most iconic projects and the main reason for its formation in 1994.



Recruit London
 supports 3,121 long-term unemployed Londoners throughout its 9-year lifespan.



Thames Festival
 initiated by CRP in 1997, and continues annually as Totally Thames, celebrating the river through art, heritage and education programmes.



Millbank Pier
 launches in 2003 to increase passenger river boat services to key cultural destinations in central London.



Clean Air Tool
 launches in 2021, and is now 1 of 8 digital tools launched by CRP to help Londoners live and work more sustainably.



Illuminated River
 supported by CRP, launches in 2021 and at 3.2 miles in length, forms the longest public art commission in the world, free for everyone to view as they walk along the River Thames.



Sustainable Urban Markets
 supports street and covered markets to maximise their potential as drivers of the local economy.

River Freight Pilot

launches along the River Thames in 2022 through CRP's Clean Air Villages Project. A follow-up trial further pushed forward CRP's ambitions to encourage sustainable logistics across London.



Golden Jubilee Bridges

aiming to spread prosperity and visitors south of the river, opened in 2002 and CRP played a pivotal role in bringing these bridges to fruition.



Central London Sub-Regional Transport Partnership

coordinated by CRP, launches in 2009 and enables partner boroughs to collaborate and share experiences related to key sub-regional transport priorities.



Pimlico Micro Logistics Hub

set up in Westminster in 2023 to consolidate freight deliveries and to use e-cargo bikes for the last miles of delivery in London.



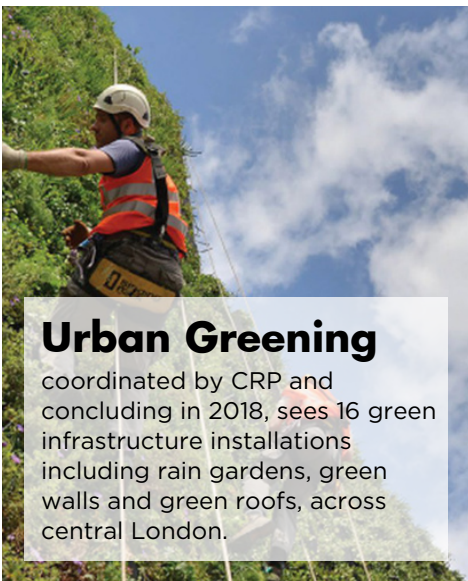
Masthouse Terrace Pier

Urban Greening

coordinated by CRP and concluding in 2018, sees 16 green infrastructure installations including rain gardens, green walls and green roofs, across central London.



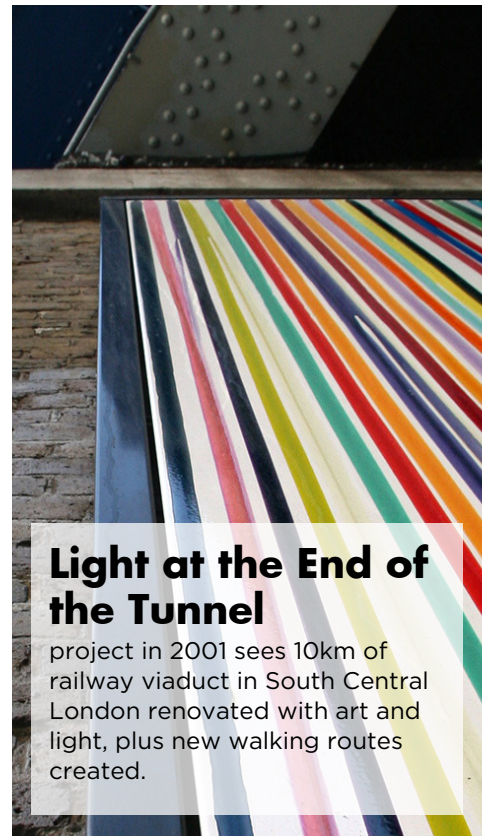

Project Highlights

2023-24

CRP completed a number of significant projects in 2023-24.

Clean Air Logistics for London (CALL)

CALL is a £1 million Defra-funded project aiming to move more freight into London via river rather than road, supported by zero emission delivery methods in Central London.

Clean Air Freight (CAF)

Impact on Urban Health-funded project helping the freight sector to deliver clean air as part of the Guy's and St Thomas' Foundation.

The project aims to prepare for more rail freight deliveries into London, including investigating the potential of passenger trains, and also trial zero emission last mile logistics from a centre in South London.

CAF Highlights



194 consolidated cargo bike trips covering 277km made from the Micro-logistics Hub to Brixton, servicing 8 businesses.



Developed study exploring potential to integrate rail freight into London's deliveries.



Produced guidance and project learning documentation to support local authorities to deliver their own Micro-logistics Hubs.



Development of the Waterloo Freight Hub to continue the legacy of the Micro Logistics Hub and Rail Freight deliveries into London.



Communications Support - EC BID

CRP collaborated with EC BID on their strategic communications and delivered a successful social media campaign over summer 2023.

The campaign promoted the EC BID area throughout the summer holidays, including exciting new restaurants, new walking maps and famous landmarks.

The social media campaign was delivered over 3 months and included 72 posts shared across LinkedIn and Twitter.



CRP has a range of projects delivering in 2023-24 that will continue into 2024-25 and beyond.

Smarter Greener Logistics (SGL)

SGL is a Defra-funded project aiming to minimise the impact of freight on noise, air quality, traffic and pavement space in London by making improvements across 14 London boroughs and two London Business Improvement Districts (BIDs). SGL builds on the success of CRP's Clean Air Logistics for London (CALL).

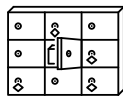

Aims



Monitoring and Data Analysis Service



Working in partnership with Vivacity Labs, CRP have continued to support South Bank BID by providing insightful traffic monitoring and data analysis services to support effective, environmentally healthy, and sustainable streetscape and public realm planning.

CRP are analysing data across nine sensors located in the BID area. The data feeds into South Bank BID's approach to evidence-based decision-making in the local area, to understand the ways that pedestrians, cyclists and motor vehicles are moving around the area.

Forward Look

CRP is looking forward to delivering a range of externally-funded programmes with its partners over 2024-25 and beyond, including the following:

Healthy Streets Everyday Phase II (HSE II)

This new £1 million Mayor's Air Quality Fund project will address the issue of over-dependence on private vehicles, and the associated issues of poor Air Quality, Environment, Safety, Health, and Wellbeing.

April 2024 - March 2027
 14 project partners
 Led by CRP / Westminster City Council

Project Aims

HSE II will address poor Air Quality by:

- S**upporting safer spaces
- T**ransforming travel behaviour
- R**educing emissions and exposure
- E**ngaging with communities
- E**mbracing technological advances
- T**argeting green infrastructure
- S**ustaining best monitoring practice

Targets against these aims will be quantified with partners once the funding proposal has been confirmed.

HSE II project activities have been estimated to bring about the following Air Quality emissions reductions over the 3-year project period:

35.77kg of NO_x

Equivalent to:



Emissions from 161 football pitch-sized forest fires

2.89kg of PM_{2.5}

Additional CRP Services

CRP will continue to seek additional sources of funding and to deliver projects valued by its partners and Londoners alike.

CRP will continue to facilitate the [Central London Sub-Regional Transport Partnership](#). The group provides a neutral forum for Boroughs to share issues, and to develop co-ordinated delivery responses to transport challenges. CRP will coordinate quarterly meetings throughout 2024 / 25 to align key priorities for CLS RTP partners focused on transport, freight and sustainable travel.

CRP will also continue to offer its [Monitoring and Data Analysis Services](#) on a consultancy basis to CRP Partners and other organisations. This includes the development of new supportive services such as public realm analysis, movement mapping and area or intervention-based reporting.
