

CROSS RIVER PARTNERSHIP CELEBRATES 30 YEARS

<u>Cross River Partnership</u> (CRP) was excited to celebrate 30 Years of Delivering London's Future Together at Sea Container's Events in the <u>London Borough of Southwark</u>. The event also marked the substantial completion of Cross River Partnership's <u>Defra</u>-funded <u>Smarter</u> <u>Greener Logistics</u> programme.

CRP's Smarter Greener Logistics (SGL) project has been led by <u>Westminster City Council</u> in collaboration with 25 project partners. The project aims to minimise the impact of freight on noise, air quality, traffic and pavement space in London by making improvements across 14 London boroughs and two London Business Improvement Districts (BIDs).

To date the Smarter Greener Logistics project has:

- Launched 7 Virtual Loading Bays
- Started preparatory works for the Waterloo Freight Hub Trial
- Finalised contracts for an Islington Micro Logistics Hub
- Installed 3 Our Bikes for e-cargo
- Completed the City Soil Lab circular waste Pilot
- Completed the London Light Freight Walking Trial
- Delivered a Courier Fair
- Installed 3 Sensors (noise & air quality)
- Completed monitoring and analysis reports

Smarter Greener Logistics is the most recent in a long list of accomplishments by Cross River Partnership over its 30 year history, including <u>Clean Air Better Business</u>, <u>Healthy Streets</u> <u>Everyday</u>, <u>Clean Air Thames</u>, <u>The Illuminated River</u>, <u>Sustainable Urban Markets</u>, <u>Light at the</u> <u>End of the Tunnel</u>, <u>Recruit London</u>, <u>Construction Employer Accord</u>, as well as the <u>Millennium</u> and <u>Golden Jubilee Bridges</u> over the River Thames.

Cross River Partnership has also launched its new <u>Consultancy Service</u>, sharing all of its 30 Years of expertise with existing and new clients alike.

Cross River Partnership was very pleased to welcome over 150 partners from Local Government, London Government, Central Government, strategic bodies, Business Improvement Districts (BIDs), landowners, transport providers, academics, think tanks, funding agencies and the voluntary sector, all working to make London Fairer, Greener and Safer by bringing together Environment, Economic, Engineering, Transport, Property, Planning, Design and Health disciplines.

Cross River Partnership was also extremely pleased that the event was attended by representatives of the cities of Amsterdam, Braga, Kozani, Milan, Riga, Turin, Vilnius, as part of the <u>Horizon</u> and <u>UKRI</u>-funded <u>JUST STREETS</u> project. We are learning from, and sharing best practice with, all of these cities, and we are very proud to show them around London over the next couple of days.
