Waterloo Freight Hub Wins at CiTTi Awards



Mile Logistics Award in recognition of the innovative Waterloo Freight Hub Trial.

The project involved cross-sector collaboration led by CRP, alongside <u>Network Rail</u>, the <u>London Borough of Lambeth</u>, the <u>Department for Transport</u>, <u>London and Continental</u> <u>Railways</u>, <u>Delivery Mates</u>, <u>Steer</u>, <u>Intermodality</u> and Waterloo Station, and funded by <u>Defra</u>.

The Waterloo Freight Hub Phase 1 Trial took place from March – July 2025 in an arch in Waterloo Station's undercroft. The trial saw huge benefits, including over 20,000 parcels delivered and 2,500 kg of CO2 emissions saved.

With long-term ambitions to deliver a much-larger, multi-modal Waterloo Freight Hub, we're thrilled to see all of our partners hard work gaining recognition.

Have Your Say: DfT Launches Consultation on the Third Cycling and Walking Investment Strategy



The <u>Department for Transport</u> (DfT) has opened a <u>public consultation</u> on the Third Cycling and Walking Investment Strategy (CWIS3), and it's a key moment for anyone interested in healthier, greener and more accessible travel across England.

The consultation is open now, and responses are encouraged from across the sector by Monday 15th December 2025.

CWIS3 sets out the Government's proposed approach for supporting walking, wheeling and cycling over the coming years. The consultation covers priorities such as improving infrastructure design, supporting local authorities to deliver high-quality routes, and ensuring that projects benefit a wide range of communities, including those who currently face barriers to active travel.

Autumn Budget Update



After a very long lead-in, the <u>Autumn Budget-2025</u> finally happened on 26th November 2025.

According to the Financial Times' Chris Giles:

- The government is working to achieve economic stability
- The rapidly ageing population is presenting huge challenges
- The current budget deficit will be higher every year up to 2029-30
- It is hard to improve public services while also addressing this

There is still the need to get confidence back, from people and businesses, to move into a virtuous circle of progress.

CRP will continue to work with its public, private and community partners to move towards green and sustainable growth, within the parameters set by the Autumn Budget.

COP30: What Happened and Why it Matters



COP30, the <u>30th Conference of the Parties to the UNFCCC</u>, was held in Belém, Pará, Brazil, at the Hangar Convention Centre this November. The conference convened nearly 200 governments, tens of thousands of delegates, and a wide array of civil society, business, Indigenous, and youth representatives.

COP30 produced a set of concrete steps to turn climate commitments into action, including tripling adaptation finance by 2035, adopting 59 new adaptation indicators, launching major nature-protection funding, and establishing a just-transition support mechanism.

Additional milestones, such as the Global Implementation Accelerator, the Belém Mission to 1.5°C, the first trade-and-climate dialogue, and stronger recognition of Indigenous Peoples, aim to accelerate and broaden global climate implementation.

For CRP that means a stronger emphasis on adaptation projects, equitable transitions, and nature-based solutions, all core to our mission.
