By embedding themselves within the Better Bankside team, co-creating long-term-ready project management frameworks, and delivering extensive engagement with Southwark SMEs, CRP enabled Better Bankside to confidently progress the Southwark Climate Collective during a period of organisational transition and establish a strong foundation for effective programme delivery.



Urban Freight Solutions Workshop

CRP supported UCL by designing and delivering a highly engaging Urban Freight Solutions Workshop that brought together over 25 key stakeholders from the rail industry, local and national government, and major delivery organisations.

By shaping the workshop structure, securing expert speakers, producing targeted materials, and managing all pre-event planning and coordination, CRP created the conditions for meaningful dialogue and collaboration. A comprehensive final report provided UCL with a clear, actionable foundation for advancing research, policy discussion, and future innovation in urban freight integration.

CRP has continued to support South Bank BID by delivering high-quality, visually engaging traffic monitoring reports that analyse complex datasets from VivaCity sensors into clear insights that inform strategic decision making.

CRP's rigorous data cleansing, continuous coordination with VivaCity, and flexible reporting approach ensured reliable, tailored outputs that strengthen the BID's ability to allocate resources effectively, communicate patterns to stakeholders, and pursue long term public realm improvements across the district.



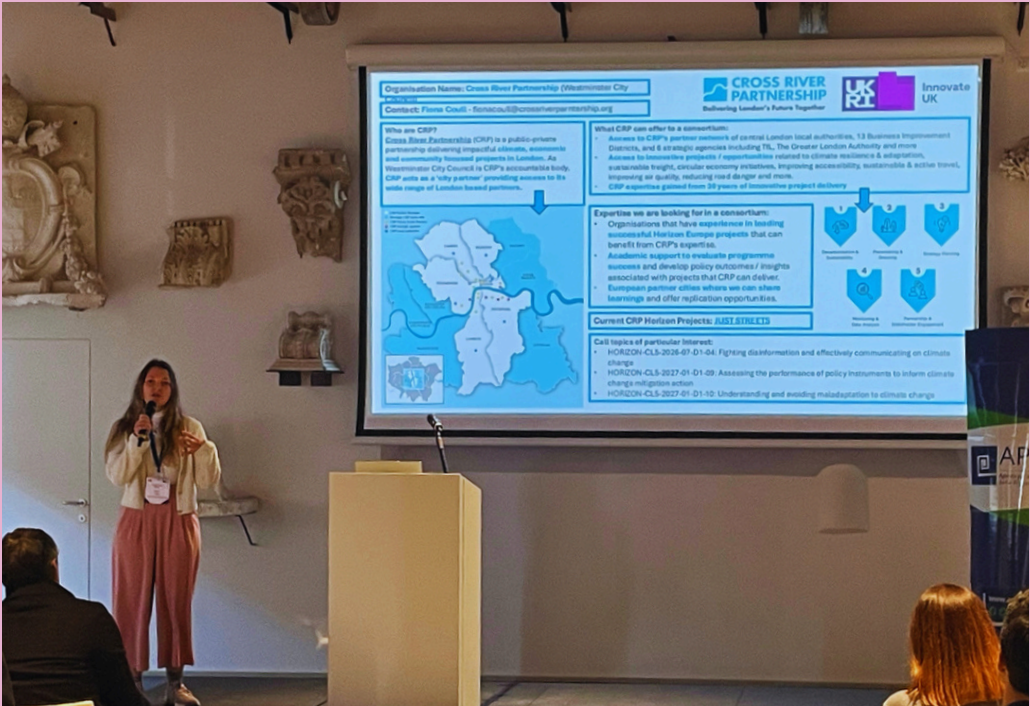

Empowering Learning Through Expert Speaker Services

CRP has delivered a range of high-level presentations, expert evidence and academic lectures across freight, place-making, health, and sustainable logistics.

This year, CRP has showcased its projects at international conferences such as ALICE and UKRI brokerage events, delivered a lecture for the University of Westminster's Masters course on Logistics and Freight Transport and delivered a session on place-based health with King's College London's CARICE Clinical Group.

This has supported us to broaden our cross-sector collaboration and engage new audiences, enhancing the profile of CRP and its Partners.



Project Management Services: West End Micro Logistics Hub Support

CRP supported Westminster City Council by providing expert project management and technical guidance to shape a new West End micro logistics hub trial, building on proven learnings from previous CRP-led hub projects.

By helping the council identify, assess and plan suitable hub sites, advising on feasibility and constraints, and leveraging CRP's extensive network of low-emission couriers and delivery partners, CRP strengthened early engagement and informed procurement approaches. CRP also supplied practical documentation, templates and hands-on capacity, working as an extension of the council team, to help navigate planning, stakeholder engagement and operational planning.

Delivery Achievements

2025 -26



CRP contributed funding through the Healthy Streets Everyday II programme to WeAreWaterloo's Transforming Hercules Road project, delivering new street trees, cycle parking, benches, and nearly 300 sq m of green space.

300
m² of plant beds

Three Healthy Streets Everyday II Steering Group sessions were delivered to support BID and local authority project partners, driving coordinated action and knowledge exchange, including two on-site meetings.

CRP acted as a key strategic advisor to TfL during the creation of the London Logistics Plan.

CRP delivered expert evidence on multimodal clean freight possibilities and implementation requirements to the London Assembly Transport Committee.

The Kerbside Use Evaluation Report was delivered, highlighting recommendations to support fairer use of kerbsides at different types of locations.

Active travel was encouraged through six campaigns, including those focused on clean-air routes, staying active after dark, and staying safe in the heat.

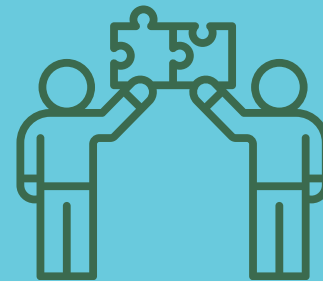

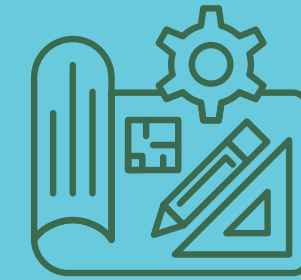

CRP hosted high profile and International Visits to the Waterloo Freight Hub including with visitors across European, Canadian, Korean and Japanese cities, Network Rail's Chair, councillors at the London Borough of Lambeth and Southwark, Greater London Authority and Transport for London's leadership and elected representatives.

Horizon Europe: myLIFEPATH

DATES: 01/05/2026 - 01/05/2029

CRP's myLIFEPATH is a Horizon Europe-funded programme that will use active travel modal shift such as walking and cycling to support the prevention and recovery from cancer across Europe. London will act as a vital case study to trial new interventions to support more active travel across the city.



Mayor of London: Healthy Streets Everyday II (HSE II)

CRP will continue to lead this three-year Mayor's Air Quality Funded programme to address the issue of over-dependence on private vehicles. So far, the project has delivered innovative School Streets, active travel routes, and green urban spaces in collaboration with a range of London Boroughs and BID's. In the year ahead the project will deliver initiatives that improve air quality. This will include exciting projects with Central District Alliance, Better Bankside, London Borough of Lambeth and Camden Town Unlimited.



Westminster Climate Fund: Sustainable City Charter (SCC) Innovation Challenge

Designed to support the Sustainable City Charter and local innovators, the Challenge will identify local SMEs with low carbon solutions and products and match them with signatories to trial these in real-world commercial settings. Through these collaborative pilot projects, the Challenge will help reduce signatories' emissions, as well as drive the growth of the low carbon industry across the borough. CRP is supporting Westminster City Council by leading engagement with Sustainable City Charter signatories and procuring / appointing a provider to design and deliver the Challenge.



Guy's & St Thomas' Trust NHS: Evaluation of GSTT Electric Bikes

Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust introduced four electric bikes at two community sites to support more sustainable clinician travel when visiting patients at home. To understand the impact of this initiative, CRP will conduct a comprehensive evaluation combining quantitative performance analysis with qualitative staff insights. The findings will inform decisions about future investment and potential scaling across the GSTT estate.



Horizon Europe: Just Streets

CRP is delivering Horizon Europe-funded interventions across London to support safe active travel and more welcoming public spaces, working with Camden Town Unlimited, Harley Street BID, and Lambeth Council on school streets, parklets, and walking routes. CRP will continue supporting Lambeth's school streets, Camden's heritage walking routes and help Harley Street BID develop a new inclusive street intervention. Over the coming year, CRP will share London insights with the 30-plus organisations in the Just Streets partnership to highlight the benefits of people-first street design.



EU Driving Urban Transitions: STREET-15

DATES: 01/01/2026 - 31/12/2028

STREET-15 is a School-Driven Transformation for Resilient, Engaged and Equitable Youth-Centric 15-Minute Neighbourhoods. It is a Driving Urban Transitions-funded initiative that collaborates with European partners to co-create school streets with young people, supporting the 15-minute city approach and urban liveability.



Launching Fairer Safer Greener

CRP is delighted to announce the launch of its new associated charity, Fairer Safer Greener (FSG). FSG has now been formally established as an independent, registered charity. FSG will enable activity that complements CRP's mission while being governed separately, with its own charitable objectives and Board. In 2026-27 we will be launching the charity and exploring funding opportunities to support our goals.

FSG activities will include:

- Public Education and Awareness
- Train and support volunteers and residents
- Community engagement and co-design

Financial Statement

CRP's contracted budget will exceed £1 million for 2026/27 (green figures).

CRP has an additional £1 million plus of potential budget to come in, dependent on funding bid outcomes (blue figures).

Traditionally, CRP also secures completely new funding streams as the financial year progresses.

CRP is continuing its successful strategy of diversifying its funding sources.

CRP is maintaining its modest annual membership fee levels of £14,000 for Local Authorities and £4,000 for Business Improvement Districts (BIDs).
